**Further comments:** Slight concern: School is such a safe place that they are not exposed to any risks or unpleasantness. It is such a friendly caring collaborative place that when they are at activities outside school that are sometimes shocked by the abruptness/ disregard for people to their safety, the way children can be rude and cruel to others.

The school is doing a fine job in keeping them safe, it is in other activities outside school such as football club or ballet where we, as parents, need to be more vigilant and aware of these issues.

One parent suggested future questionnaires should be conducted through Survey Monkey, which offers anonymity. Point noted.

**ANALYSIS:**

1. Very high percentage of parents stated that their children feel safe and happy and they had no concerns regarding their safety at school.
2. All parents who have raised concerns unanimously agreed that the matter had been dealt with swiftly and satisfactorily.
3. 86.6% felt that their children would have no difficulties in asking for help or reporting a concern.
4. One identified area where we could improve is to communicate to parents aspects of Safeguarding covered at school. This is covered in PHSE lessons and through Assemblies on e-safety.
5. One family was not sure whether their child would know what to do in the event of a fire. Teachers to spend time prior to next Fire Practice explaining the purpose and the procedures to follow, (4.+5 discussed at Board Meeting on 20 03 18 and actions agreed).
